Building level initiatives:

The building blocks of Phonemic Awareness

Laying a strong foundation for reading



- 12 Rhyme one-syllable words
(cart, part, smart, and art)
- 11 Blend two-syllable words
(blend the sounds /b- a- s- k- e- t/ into basket)
- 10 Isolate the medial vowel sound
(identify /e/ as the medial sound in nest)
- 9 Change the final sound to make new words
(change met into mess, men)
- 8 Isolate the final sound
(identify /t/ as the final sound in block)
- 7 Change the initial sound to create new words
(change cat into that, hat, part)
- 6 Isolate the initial sound
(identify /t/ as the first sound in build)
- 5 Segment one-syllable words
(segment cat into /k- a- t/)
- 4 Recognize and distinguish between similar sounds
(Notice the similarities and differences between /th/ in thin and /th/ in then)
- 3 Blend one-syllable words from an auditory prompt
(blend the sounds /b- a- g/ into bag)
- 2 Blend two words into a compound with an auditory prompt
(blend the words rain + bow into rainbow)
- 1 Develop a kinesthetic awareness of sounds
(Say /p/. What is your mouth doing? What do your lips do? Can you feel or coming out?
Say /t/. What is the same? What is different? Place your hand on your throat. What do you feel?)



Evaluate curriculum:

- Evaluate the alignment of phonemic awareness and phonics instruction across grade levels with an emphasis on syllabication instruction.




Expand instructional approaches:

- Implement quality instructional strategies by analyzing CT English Language Proficiency Standards (CELP) using individual Language Assessment Scales (LAS) student proficiency reports

Steps for Syllabication

Label the..


1. Vowels	r e l a x v v
2. Consonant(s) between the Vs	r e l a x v c v
Think..	
3. Syllable pattern?	r e l a x v c v
4. Slash it!	r e l a x v c v
5. Read each syllable. Open syllable? Closed syllable?	r e l a x v c v
6. Read the whole word!

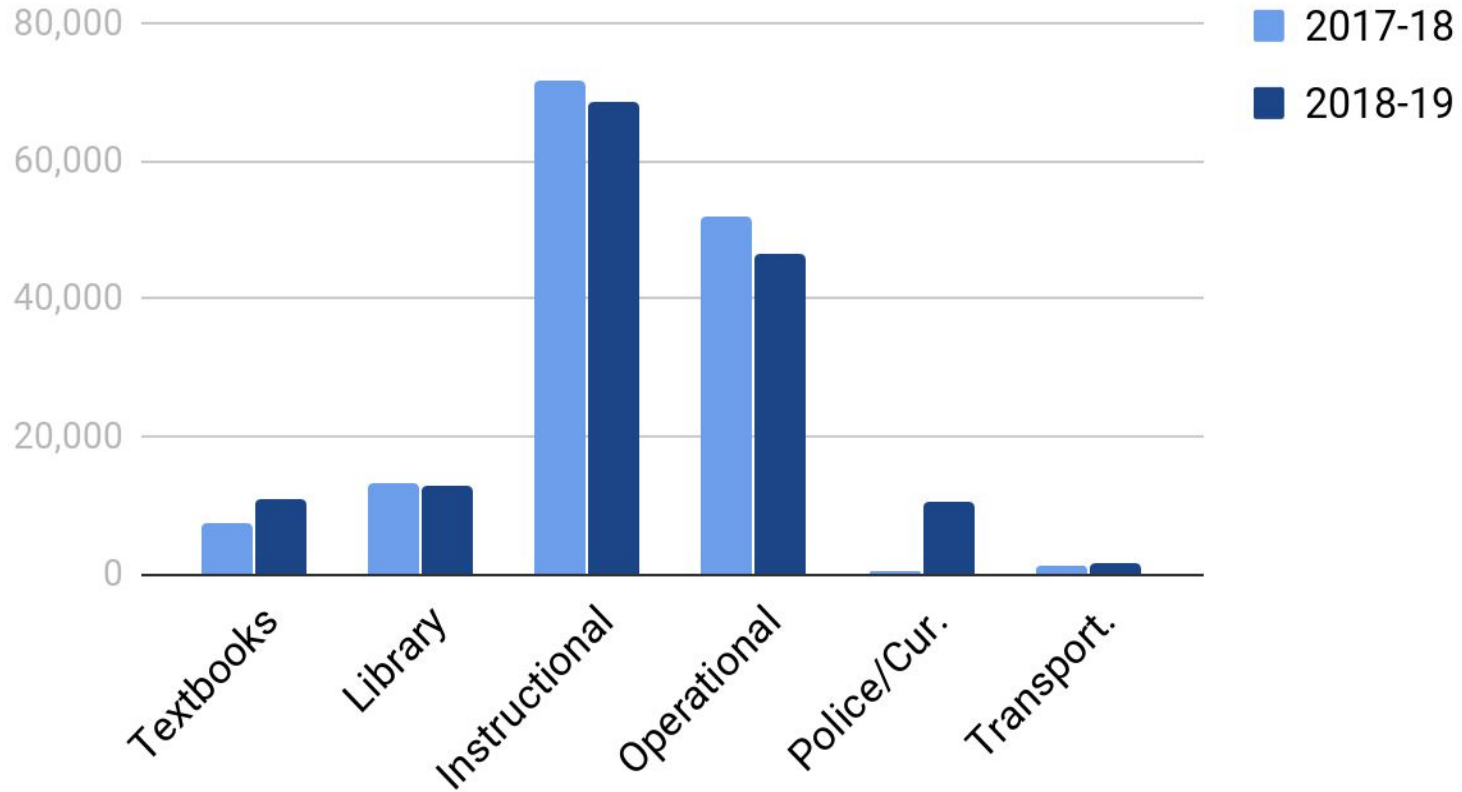

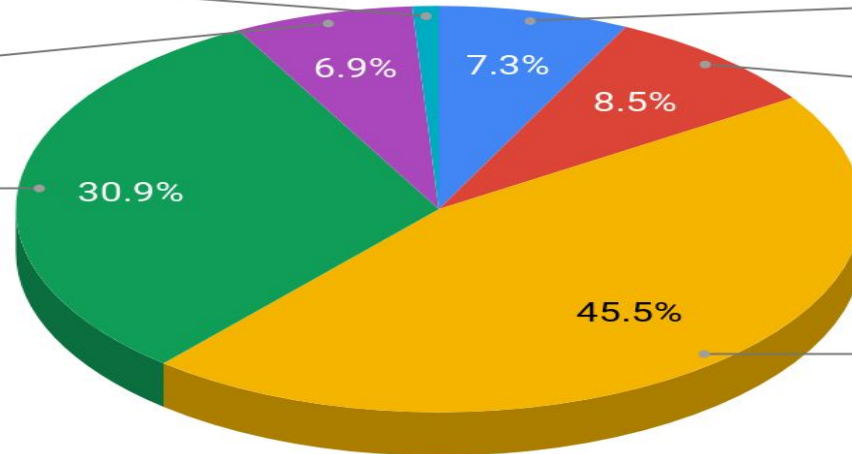
