Discussion Questions for WishTree

Questions to ask your reader (these work great if you haven't read the book):

- Who was your favorite character? What did you like about that character?
- Red says of Sumar and of him/herself that they need to "stand tall, reach deep." What does that mean to you? Have you ever had to stand tall and reach deep?
- Why do you think the animals are so comfortable with Samar? Has anything like that ever happened to you?
- Red says of Sumar's family, "Their words held new music." What do you think that means?
- What do you think would have happened to the neighborhood and the animals if Francesca had cut down the tree?
- What wish would you tie on the wishtree?
- Red likes to make others feel safe. Are there things in nature that make you feel safe?

Book club questions (these would be more appropriate if you've read the book):

- Red asks, "How does friendship happen?" What do Red and the animals decide? What do you think?
- Why does Francesca want to cut the tree down? Based on her reasons, would you cut the tree down?
- Red says that "Making others feel safe is a fine way to spend your days." Who feels safe with Red, and how can you tell? What does Red do that makes others feel safe? Do you agree with Red's statement? How do you make others feel safe? What do others do that make you feel safe?
- Why do you think Red spoke to Samar and Stephen? Why won't Red speak to Francesca?
- Why do you think the boy carved "leave" in the tree? When he sees all the wishes that say "stay", what is he going to think?
